For nearly three decades, Jeff Corwin has brought the wonder of wildlife and nature to audiences around the world. His celebrated television work has appeared across ABC, NBC, CNN, Disney Channel, Animal Planet, Travel Channel, Food Network, National Geographic, and Discovery Networks.

Corwin is the creator, executive producer, and presenter of ABC's *Wildlife Nation*, which explores North American conservation and introduces viewers to the people working to protect endangered species and wilderness. His landmark series include Disney Channel's *Going Wild with Jeff Corwin*, Animal Planet's global hit *The Jeff Corwin Experience*, CNN's *Planet in Peril*, and ABC's *Ocean Treks*. His television work has earned multiple Emmy Awards and other major broadcast honors.

A wildlife biologist, journalist, author, explorer, and producer, Corwin has reported from the front lines of conservation around the world. He served as an environmental correspondent for CBS and NBC News during the Gulf oil spill and created the acclaimed Nat Geo Wild series *Alaska Animal Rescue*. He has also contributed to the giant-screen film *Expedition Chesapeake* and narrated the cinematic documentary *Galapagos: Nature's Wonderland*.

Corwin holds degrees in biology and anthropology from Bridgewater State University and a master's degree in wildlife and fisheries conservation from the University of Massachusetts Amherst. He is the author of ten books on wildlife and nature and has devoted his career to inspiring people to understand, cherish, and protect the natural world.
